DISTINGUISHED SPEAKERS TWO AUTHORS IN CONVERSATION




On August 15, Cynthia Zarin and Michael Cunningham, writers with long-time Outer-Cape connections, will take the stage in Wellfleet's Congregational Church as our 2024 Distinguished Speakers.

Cynthia Zarin is an award-winning poet, the author of five books of poems, two essay collections, and several books for children. She is a long-time contributor to *The New Yorker*. Her most recent books are *Inverno*, a novel, published in January, and *Next Day: New & Selected Poems*, forthcoming in August.

Michael Cunningham's most recent novel, *Day*, was published in November 2023. Among his other novels are *The Hours*, *Specimen Days*, *By Nightfall*, and *The Snow Queen*. His essays and short stories have appeared in the New Yorker, the Atlantic, the Paris Review, and other publications.

MUSIC PROGRAMS

Winter Saturdays in the Library meeting room were alive with free concerts of a rich variety of musical styles and genres.


The series began with **Fortunate Daughter**, with Heather Watson and Alex Sesenton, a new duo who gave the enthusiastic audience music from bluegrass and southern rock to classical. Both played guitar.

The Fred Magee Band. Fred Magee on keyboard, A.J. Geoghegan on bass, Jo Miller on fiddle, and Peter Tighe on drums. A quirky and fun program of Fred's original songs from Americana to blues and country.

A Tribute to Irving Berlin. John Murelle with Chris Morris on piano and vocalist Johanna Stipetic, performed Berlin's music. John also gave a visual presentation of Berlin's life and work.

Long Time Traveling. Katie Hickey, Jim Rohrer and Alice Malone performed traditional music that Jim called, "a bunch of old songs." Ballads, gospel songs, bluegrass, and songs written by the Carter family.

Toast and Jam. Playing multiple instruments, Tim Dickey and Julie Charland sang country songs, folk, bluegrass and several original compositions, and were joined by Blake Newman on bass and Alice Malone on fiddle.









The enthusiastic audiences ranged in number from 55 to over 100 with people standing in the hallway to listen. The Friends are happy to present these free concerts. Friends board member Gayle Adams deserves credit for bringing these artists to the library's meeting room every winter.

The Friends will present two music programs this summer. Tom Leidenfrost on June 20, and Robert Markowitz on July 11.

WOMEN IN SCIENCE

In March, to celebrate Women's History Month, the Friends sponsored presentations by scientists conducting research in a variety of domains.

Paulette Durazo is a member of the Center for Coastal Studies Marine Entanglement Response Team and a Research Assistant for the Humpback Whale Studies. She described the efforts to prevent the entanglements.

Stephanie Ellis has been connected to wildlife rehabilitation and avian conservation efforts on both coasts. She was the Director of the Santa Clara Valley Audubon Society, CA, and is the Executive Director of Wild Care of Cape Cod.

Sharon Kreamer, a member of the Horseshoe Crab Conservation Association of Cape Cod, has contributed to Horseshoe Crab Science and Conservation Workshops in Hong Kong Korea and Japan. Her topic was The Horseshoe Crab: An Ancient Mariner and Modern Medical Marvel.

Katie Castagno is the director of the Land-Sea Interaction Program at the Center for Coastal Studies in Provincetown, MA. Her research focuses on the intersections among coastal resilience, salt marsh restoration, and sediment transport. Her topic was Duck Harbor and the Herring River: A Geologic Story.
